What do you think? I received a phone call from, he said, the great grandson of Ned Kelly, and he would like to visit Mt Horrocks as he had heard the Lavender Federation Trail had set up a loop viewing trail off the Mintaro-Watervale section.

We whizzed up the mount with the first stop at what we understand was a recess where the Wrights' 1850s cattle rustlers used to flash signals across to an accomplice on a western range lookout.

Could local Wrights be connected with 'Wild Wright', a known Kelly sympathiser?
